Psalm 78: 1-7

Bible Verse: Psalm 78:1 “O my people, hear my teaching; listen to the words of my mouth.”

Think about how you hear stories. Your Mom or Dad or Grandma or Grandpa may tell you stories. You hear stories at church and when you go to school, your teacher might tell you a story. You may hear stories as someone reads books to you. You might also enjoy stories as you watch television or on a computer.

At this time in our history, we have many ways of hearing and even seeing stories.

A very long time ago, there were no televisions. There were no computers. There were very few people who could read or write. Stories were shared through talking. Parents and Grandparents would share important stories with their children and their children would share stories with their children and so on. Eventually some stories were drawn into pictures. In some countries, churches have drawing on walls and windows that tell Bible stories so that people who could not read could learn from pictures.

Our Bible lesson today talks about a time when someone gathered people together to tell them about great things God has done and great things that God does. The story teller wanted for people to know God and to love and trust God.

God wants for us to know Him and trust Him as well. When your Mom or Dad or Grandma or Grandpa or Pastor Caroline tells you stories about God and Jesus, I hope you enjoy listening and someday you can enjoy sharing these same stories with your children.
